## A Message from Rabbi Perkins

### May the Voice of the Turtledove Long Be Heard in Our Land, April 2016

I love this time of year. Put away that winter coat! It's gradually getting warmer and the days are getting longer. Clearly, spring is about to burst upon the scene, and even those of us who've stayed inside most of the winter are finding ourselves drawn to go outside.

As we read in Song of Songs:

For lo, the winter is past;

And the rain has come and gone.

The flowers appear on the earth,

The time of singing has come;

And the voice of the turtledove is heard in our land.

(Song of Songs; 2:11-12)

In the springtime, it's easy to appreciate nature. Who doesn't appreciate the resurgence of nature at this time of year? Listen to the words of Yehudah Ha-Levi (1075-1141), one of the greatest Hebrew poets of all time, who wrote the following in "A Letter to His Friend Isaac:"

And now the Spring is here with yearning eyes;

Midst shimmering golden flowerbeds;

On meadows carpeted with varied hues;

In richest raiment clad she treads.

She weaves a tapestry of blooms over all.

Experiencing and appreciating nature help keep us human. They also nurture deeply spiritual yearnings within us. (See the essay by Aliza Berger, our Rabbinic Intern in the following pages.)

And yet, appreciating nature isn't enough. For, as I hope we all know by now, the natural world is threatened — by us.

There are many, many ways in which our behavior in the aggregate, as a species, impacts negatively on the environment. And we therefore have the responsibility, not only in springtime, but in winter, summer, and fall, to minimize our impact and to try to ameliorate

the situation.

Some of us were able to attend our Social Action Committee's Mitzvah Day back in January, in which we learned about steps that our community as a whole, and we as individuals, can take to minimize our impact on the environment. (See Janet Besser and Rachel Weinstock's description on page 5.) Many thanks to those who planned and participated in that program.

I would like to emphasize that caring for the environment isn't just a technical challenge: it's a moral and a religious one.

Rabbi Saul Berman puts it this way. There are two religious challenges and therefore two stages in our religious responsibility to environmental issues.

The first is called, in Hebrew, *hatzalah* (short-term rescue). The duty to rescue springs from the famous Biblical passage: "*You shall not stand idly by.*" (Leviticus 19:16) As Rabbi Berman puts it, "The real risk in our continued pollution of the environment is not the earth; rather, it is humankind." Through our thoughtless and negligent treatment of the earth, we are threatening our collective home. "If we love humanity, then we must now act to save it from ourselves."

Beyond immediate rescue, we must reorient ourselves. We must step away from an arrogant, dismissive approach to the Earth and adopt a more humble one:

"The longer-term solution to environmental problems depends upon our ability to re-educate ourselves and our children towards humility – towards *anavah* – and moderation. We need to devote ourselves to the elimination of material excess in our lives, in our homes, in our offices, in what we eat, and in the technology that we utilize so wastefully. *Even our waste is wastefully disposed of.* Only such a reorientation, in which material excess is replaced with deep spiritual awareness of the ultimate partnership between humanity and the Earth in the achievement of God's goals, can we lay the foundation for a new and more healthy relationship between us and our environment.

"The challenge ahead of us is the common challenge of science and religion together: to discover and implement the means of assuring the physical survival of humanity on Earth, to discover and implement the means of assuring the spiritual survival of a more humble and more modest humanity on this, God's earth." (Rabbi Saul Berman, "*Jewish Environmental Values: The Dynamic Tension Between Nature and Human Needs*")

To which I would like to add: *kein yehi ratzon*—so may it be God's will. And so may it be ours.

### “Scat-tered Trails to the Divine”

When I was little, we lived in the mountains of Evergreen, Colorado. It was pretty rustic then -- for groceries or supplies we had to drive out sometimes all the way to Denver, but I loved being nestled in the mountaintops. I loved waking up to the possibility of elk munching on the grass next to the swing set or rubbing their antlers against the slide. I would gaze out my window and watch with barely contained glee, imagining what it would be like to run with them through the trees.

When we ventured out into the mountains as a family, the deer and the elk stayed away, probably spooked by my joyful banter and enthusiastic shouts of discovery. Knowing my deer and elk friends could not be far, I became an expert in identifying signs of where they had been and where they might have gone. I scoured the ground for footprints or antlers but, more often than not, encountered my friends through the piles of scat they left behind. I loved the brown piles of pellets that littered the trails and was proud of my expert identification skills. I knew which pile came from deer and which from elk, and which was from a predator of some sort.

It wasn't until years later that I learned the Torah of my childhood pastime.

According to Lurianic Kabbalah, there was a time when the whole of universe was God's light, called *Ain Sof*. God dreamed of creating a world, and so God contracted God's-self in order to make space for creation. In a process known as *tzimtzum*, God folded the light of *Ain Sof* into vessels, called *kelim*. But, these vessels could not hold back God's light. They shattered and fell into the created world. Most of God's light returned to The Source, *Mekor HaHayyim*, except for tiny sparks of light, called *nitzutzim*, which remained stuck to the shards of the broken vessels, *the klippot*, which now littered creation. According to this creation myth, it is up to us to uncover the shards of brokenness that we find in the world and elevate the sparks of light back to God.

God, in Kabbalistic imagery, is often depicted as a deer who drinks from the streams of Torah and wanders by as we sit quietly in creation. Like a mountain deer, our glimpses of God are fleeting and shy, yet fill us with a sense of wonder and leave behind a trail of gratitude. Jewish practice tunes our eyes and our hearts to the footprints God leaves behind.

When I think about environmentalism, I think <sub>4</sub>about my four-year-old self running through

the mountains of Colorado following a trail of scat. In some ways, we are all joyful four year-olds waking up to the hopeful possibility that God might appear in our backyard. Sometimes when we journey through the world and don't see God walking in front of us, we feel lonely and long for connection.

But, we can always look to the natural world around us and see the wonder of creation. We can find the piles of refuse and see in them what was, and release them back into the world as compost that will fuel new growth. We can, like God, contract our carbon footprints to make space for new light. And even though there will be choices we make that will leave behind trails in the world, we can pray that everything we leave behind on this earth will create pathways for future generations to joyfully follow the Divine.



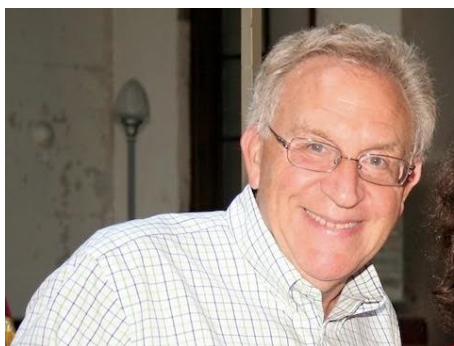

### Update on Mitzvah Day

Mitzvah Day this year was held on Erev Tu B'Shevat, January 24<sup>th</sup>, which inspired the theme of raising environmental awareness on a personal, local and global level.

**Rabbi Katy Z. Allen**, Jewish Climate Action Network (JCAN), was the keynote speaker. She spoke about JCAN's efforts to mobilize the Jewish community for bold action and leadership to counter climate change. Participants then rotated through the three roundtable discussion groups.

For personal inspiration, **Dr. Hannah Gardener**, a Temple Aliyah member, talked about tips for a less toxic home and healthy living. She also led everyone in making two "green" cleaning solutions to take home. **Gary Smith** from Needham Recycling & Transfer Station presented a slide show about Needham's Solar Project and the Reduce, Reuse, Recycle program. It was surprising to learn about all the activity at the "dump," and the positive impact from new efforts to recycle and reuse material, resulting in cost savings to the town. TA member **David Eisenberg** brought the conversation to a global level, speaking about the Arava Institute, a Middle East leading environmental and academic institution, dedicated to preparing future leaders from Israel, Palestine, Jordan, and around the world to cooperatively solve the regional and global challenges. ### It's Great To Be Engaged!

We all know how ecstatic we are to learn that a couple has announced their engagement. What I have been trying to do in the past 6 months here at Temple Aliyah is to capture that kind of excitement and channel it into what it means to be engaged *Jewishly*. After all, doesn't the magnificence of our heritage, the beauty of our rituals, the glory of our music and sacred prayers, and the holiness we bring to our families through Jewish living at least warrant this same excitement and, yes, awe?

To begin bringing these somewhat lofty ideals into focus I have embarked on a number of initiatives to bring me closer to the wonderful people at TA, to bring individuals and families closer together, and to strengthen the relationship that our members have with the shul.

As my contribution to this issue of e-Shofar, I am pleased to present a snapshot of my engagement work at Temple Aliyah:

- I have enjoyed meeting with members young and not-so-young, prospects and even past members – usually over coffee at some of Needham's fine cafes and restaurants – to learn about people's Jewish journeys, how they came to TA, and suggestions they might have to strengthen our shul. This has been dubbed a *Listening Campaign* through which I typically meet one or two people each week, so if you'd like to get together please contact me at [tep@templealiyah.com](mailto:tep@templealiyah.com).
- It's been great fun volunteering at *Gan Aliyah*, supporting the excellent faculty with Judaica and Hebrew songs, and getting to know the pre-schoolers while beginning to connect with their parents.
- Because of prior connections in the Jewish community, I've been able to help bring speakers to Temple Aliyah on several important topics – Dr. Stanley Wulf ("Managing Conflict When Talking About Israel"), Rabbi Joseph Meszler (Brotherhood Shabbat speaker on men and boys in Judaism), and coming up in May we will welcome Deborah Shelkan Remis to TA. The daughter of the late Cantor Gregor Shelkan who served Congregation Mishkan Tefila for over 50 years, Deborah will tell the amazing story of her father's first wife, Sara (a violin virtuoso of wide acclaim in Europe), who died at a very young age during the holocaust. **Sara's Voice will be brought to Temple Aliyah on Wednesday, May 4 at 7:45 pm.** Plan now to attend.

- I have also been involved in Engagement Training for TA's Board of Trustees and, following a well-attended breakfast meeting in November, we will now open one of these programs to the congregation. I am proud to announce that we will be offering a synagogue-wide **breakfast workshop on Sunday, April 10 from 9:30 am–noon with Bob Leventhal, Director of Leadership Development at the New York-based United Synagogue of Conservative Judaism**. At this interactive session with one of the country's leading experts on synagogue vision and vitality, we will explore what brings people to our synagogue – and what keeps them away; what it means to be a *Thriving Congregation*; what's thriving at Temple Aliyah... and what are some of the things we need to change.
- Finally, a group of 20 people from TA attended our first-ever Yoga & Mindfulness Retreat – a relaxing, inspirational 2-day program March 20 & 21 at the Kripalu Center for Yoga & Health in the Berkshires. Although my title would suggest that I'm the engagement guy at Temple Aliyah, I would argue that each and every one of us – clergy, professionals, congregants – has a responsibility to think of Jewish engagement as one of his or her major priorities. ## **Reflecting on the Kripalu Retreat**

The first thing you notice when you walk into Kripalu is the pace. No one is rushing. You soak in the stunning view of the lake and the mountains through their generous windows and suddenly realize that your shoulders are up way too high. That was just the beginning of Temple Aliyah's retreat at Kripalu.

Our group of 20 first met in a private group room to get an overview of our two-day stay. The schedule was balanced with group time, yoga time, and personal time. Some of us knew each other well, some of us from a distance, and some not at all. But we all had similar wishes: to make deeper connections with our Temple Aliyah community and to be able to integrate some mindfulness back into our lives.

Of course one way to do either is through food which was plentiful, wholesome, and delicious. There was even macaroni and cheese for those who fear fruits and vegetables. Activities included yoga classes at various levels of experience, yoga dance (awesome and not awkward BTW), two hikes, one vigorous and one gentler, meditation classes, a workout room, and even a sauna and whirlpool area.

A Jewish retreat, or any Jewish get-together for that matter, would not be complete without learning and prayer. We learned from Kripalu practitioners and from our Rabbi Perkins. And we discussed and questioned. We learned about how Jewish wisdom teaches us about living in the here and now, and to be true to self (*baruch atah*), to community (*Adonai eloheinu*), and to the universe (*melech ha'olam*). A highlight for me was the beautiful *shacharit* morning service put together by Alan Teperow and his lovely wife Suzanne Hanser. They brought meaning to our prayers by encouraging intention of our words and by sharing music to uplift our souls.

But sometimes the most meaningful experiences occur within those "in-between" times. Yogis might say...what happens between the inhalation and the exhalation. What happened was we drifted over to say hi to a member that we hadn't known that well before or joined a small TA group chatting, or went to one of the several lounges late at night only to find 3 others from TA welcoming you to share a snack. And you realize that you did make those deeper community connections and that every time I will say "*Baruch atah Adonai eloheinu melech ha'olam*" from now on I will be mindful of the gift we have been given to be part of this community.

### New Pathways into Temple Aliyah – A Year of Firsts

Everyone for their generous contributions to this year's annual appeal. The response was widespread and the campaign was very successful.

As I write to you now there is much excitement and energy at Temple Aliyah. This past Shabbat morning during kiddush, a congregant told me that she made a pledge during the High Holidays to come to shul and actively participate at least one Shabbat each month. She was very excited to share that she had had little trouble keeping her pledge. I asked why and learned that she was drawn in by the new programming that we are rolling out on Saturday mornings, and in particular for this congregant, the yoga class.

This has been a year of many innovative programming "firsts" for Temple Aliyah that are creating new pathways for engagement and a lot of "hummmmm" in the shul on Saturday mornings. These sessions are offered from 9 -10 am, allowing participants to join in the traditional service in time for the Torah service with the broader congregation.

Naomi Litrownik first blazed this trail for us, offering a series of meditation services on Shabbat mornings. This year, we have expanded the menu through the guidance and leadership of Aliza Berger, our Rabbinic Intern. We introduced Shabbat Yoga, Poses d' Zimra, in the Kehillah room. The community immediately embraced the idea, turning out such an overflow crowd for the first session that we moved to a larger space for the second! I joined the first session – a bit shaky at first but I found the class to be a perfect spiritual and physical warm up for our traditional service. As I performed Hagbah that morning, the Torah seemed to float. I am convinced that the yoga class was the reason. So for those aspiring to lift the Torah, our yoga class is for you!

Last month we welcomed our first Shabbat Torah study group in the library, an inspiring way to welcome Shabbat morning, connect to the week's parshah, share ideas and make connections with other congregants. Keeping with the theme of yoga, Alan Teperow, our Director of Planning and Engagement, planned a two-day retreat at the Kripalu Center for Yoga and Health in Stockbridge that included yoga classes, lectures, hiking and much more. And if these offerings were not enough to keep your mind and body active and engaged, the shul hosted its first ever tennis event on March 27 at the Natick Racquet Club where some of us played, learned to play, or simply schmoozed and socialized with our fellow congregants.

In keeping with our pledge to bring you a broad range of pathways to engagement, we are holding "A Thriving Congregation Workshop" on Sunday April 10 from 9:30 to noon. Bob Leventhal, Director of Leadership Development at USCJ and one of the country's foremost experts on synagogue vision and vitality will lead this exciting program. Please save the date and join your fellow TA members as this workshop promises to be very thought-provoking and will play an important role in our future planning.

As I said, our shul is literally humming (or is it 'ohming') with activity. I hope to see you at all of our great upcoming events.



### **ANNOUNCING THE PUBLIC PHASE OF THE ALIYAH B'YACHAD CAMPAIGN!**

Aliyah B'Yachad is a fundraising campaign for our future! In celebrating Temple Aliyah's 50th anniversary, we have many reasons to be proud of the accomplishments of the past fifty years. Now we must look ahead and take steps to ensure that our synagogue can meet the challenges of the next fifty years.

As of March 27, 2016, more than \$475,000 has been pledged for the Aliyah B'Yachad campaign - more than half way toward our goal of \$750,000. We want to thank our generous donors, and if you haven't pledged already, we hope that you will soon - our campaign ends June 30, 2016.

This campaign has two major objectives that will help Temple Aliyah build its membership base and provide greater financial viability for the future:

1. Provide funding to sustain our new Gan Aliyah Preschool in the coming years. Thanks in part to the generous contributions of our congregants, Gan Aliyah Preschool opened its doors in September 2014 with eight toddlers. This year we have fifteen children enrolled! Next year, we project twenty-one children between the ages of two and four. These children and their families represent the future of Temple Aliyah.
2. Retire the synagogue's mortgage loans. Currently, Temple Aliyah owes over \$500,000 on its mortgage loans, at an annual debt service cost of close to \$50,000 from operating funds. Unlike a home mortgage loan, the interest does not generate tax benefits because Temple Aliyah is a tax-exempt, nonprofit entity. These funds can be put to better use.

By providing funding for Gan Aliyah Preschool until it is self-sustaining, we will:

- Allow Gan Aliyah Preschool to grow without placing an undue burden on the synagogue's operating budget
- Continue to attract families with young children and give them an opportunity to create a bond with our community as their children grow
- Be able to provide financial assistance to families who need it in order to attend our preschool

By retiring the synagogue's mortgage, we can redirect operating funds from debt service to:

- Support programming for congregants of all ages to engage them in Jewish communal life
- Keep dues at a reasonable level to make membership more affordable in order to attract more families and retain existing families
- Provide financial assistance to help families become and remain members of the Temple Aliyah community
